

BY-LAW NUMBER 146-74

Being a by-law of the New Town of Fox Creek requiring milk sold, offered for sale or delivered within the limits of the said Town to be pasteurized before being sold, offered for sale or delivered.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 10 of the Public Health Act that the council of any city, town or village of a population of three hundred or over may pass a by-law for the purpose of requiring milk sold, offered for sale or delivered; and

WHEREAS the population of the New Town of Fox Creek exceeds three hundred;

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of Administrators of the New Town of Fox Creek in council assembled ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. For the purpose of this by-law, "pasteurization" and "pasteurized" shall have the meaning given to these words in Section 10 of The Public Health Act.
2. No person shall sell, offer for sale or deliver within the limits of the New Town of Fox Creek, milk which has not been pasteurized.
3. Section 2 of this by-law shall not apply to milk brought into the Town by the producer and sold by wholesale to a distributor, a milk processing plant, a creamery or a cheese factory, nor to products of milk prepared in a plant and by methods approved by the Provincial Board of Health.
4. This by-law shall take effect on the date of the final passing thereof.
5. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) exclusive of costs, and in default of payment of the fine and costs, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding sixty days.
